

World Peace Event Organizers' Protocol

1. Purpose of the Protocol

The purpose of the World Peace Event is to enable people living in different countries, cities, and communities to connect with one another in a peaceful, open, and cooperative way.

The events are not political gatherings, religious events, or occasions intended to represent any ideology. Their purpose is to express peace, human dignity, cooperation, and mutual respect.

2. Fundamental Principles for Organizers

Every organizer undertakes to represent the values of peace throughout the event.

The event is founded on:

non-violence

respect

dialogue

cooperation

acceptance

community responsibility

The event ensures political independence:

it does not support any political party

it is not a campaign event

it may not serve political purposes

it may not be used to intensify conflicts or divisions

The event is open to everyone who supports peace. Participation is independent of:

nationality

origin

religion

worldview or beliefs

social background

3. Organizers' Responsibilities

I. Appointment of a Local Organizer

Every event requires:

a responsible contact person

an organizing team

an official point of contact

The local organizer is responsible for:

coordinating the programme

communicating with participants

preparing the venue

ensuring compliance with the fundamental principles

II. Preparing the Event

a) Determining the format of the event. Based on its own possibilities, the local community may choose:

a peace walk

a community gathering

a cultural programme

a public discussion

a concert

a family event

a community action

tree planting or a nature conservation programme

The format may be freely adapted, but it must be connected to the message of peace.

b) Selecting the venue. The venue should be:

safe

easily accessible

acceptable to everyone

suitable for a peaceful community gathering

The organizer must take into account:

local regulations

permits

rules governing the use of public spaces

III. Inviting Participants

Invitations may be extended through:

social media

local organizations

personal contacts

Communication should be:

positive

peaceful

inclusive

free from political hostility

4. Communication Guidelines

The following should be avoided:

messages that incite hatred

attacks against other groups

provoking political disputes

fear or division

The following should be encouraged:

emphasizing shared values

personal stories

showcasing cooperation

5. Guidelines for Conducting the Event

I. Opening

The organizer presents:

the purpose of the event

the rules of peaceful participation

the programme schedule

II. Shared Message of Peace

The event may include:

a shared reflection

a message of peace

a moment of silent remembrance

a shared symbolic action

III. Connection

Important elements include:

people meeting one another

conversation

building community connections

IV. Conflict Management Protocol

If a conflict arises:

1. The organizer intervenes calmly.

2. Dialogue is given priority.

3. The following are not permitted:

violent behaviour

hate speech

harassment of others

4. In serious cases, the organizer acts in accordance with local laws.

Preserving the peaceful nature of the event is the highest priority.

V. Political and Religious Neutrality

The following are not permitted at the event:

party-political campaigning

political propaganda

religious proselytizing

attacks against other belief systems or views

Every participant takes part as a human being, not as a political or religious representative.

VI. Documentation

Organizers may document the event through:

photographs

videos

reports

participants' stories

The purpose of the documentation is:

sharing experiences

helping other communities

supporting the development of the peace network

Participants must be informed in advance about the recording of photographs or videos.

VII. Tasks After the Event

The organizers prepare:

a brief event report

participant feedback

a summary of lessons learned

The following may be shared:

what worked well

what challenges arose

what ideas emerged

VIII. International Connection

Local events:

operate independently

may retain their own identity

may preserve their own community structure

Their connection aims to:

inspire one another

exchange experiences

build a shared peace network

IX. Organizers' Ethical Declaration

The organizer declares:

"I undertake to organize the World Peace Event in the spirit of peace, human dignity, cooperation, and mutual respect. I will not use it to serve political, religious, or personal interests. My goal is to connect people and support peaceful coexistence."
